

Statutory Declaration Notes

The statutory declaration must include:

- i. Your name and Address.
- ii. State that you own the pony (registered name and number).
- iii. The date you purchased the pony.
- iv. Who you purchased the pony from – their name and address.
- v. Who has owned the animal previously (including dates to and from if known)
- vi. The solicitor then needs to sign/declare the document.
- vii. The Statutory Declaration must either be on the Solicitor's headed paper, or stamped accordingly by the Solicitor's practice to verify authenticity.

Try and give as much information as possible.

Example

- 1) I Mrs S Smith* of 123 Nameless Road*, Somewhere Town, England, solemnly and sincerely declare:
- 2) I am the owner of Fourlegged Horse* registration number 123456*, registered with The Welsh Pony and Cob Society.
- 3) I confirm that I purchased the animal from Mr J Bloggs*, of 456 No name Lane*, Said Town. On the 23rd March 1999.
- 4) Previous to this I believe the pony was owned by Miss Jones* of Town Lane from 1994-1996* and previous to this I have no history.

And I make this solemn declaration conscientiously believing the same to be true and by virtue of the statutory declarations act 1835
